BRAMMER has cut waste and saved energy to help it secure internationally recognised environmental accreditation.

The UK’s leading industrial maintenance, repair and overhaul (MRO) products distributor has achieved ISO 14001: 2004.

It has introduced a series of measures to address environmental issues, including:

- employee training and awareness
- respecting environmental legislation and regulations
- continually setting and improving environmental objectives and targets
- investing in technology and projects resulting in low environmental impact on bought in materials, manufacturing processes, and packaging and distribution methods.
- minimising waste produced across all areas of the business

BRAMMER has increased recycling (in 2006 it recycled 14.42 tons of cardboard versus 9.72 tons in 2005) and taken steps to reduce gas, water and electricity consumption.

Managing director Ian Ritchie said: “As an industrial MRO distributor advocating the use of products that result in reduced environmental impact, it is essential that we are seen to be adhering to the highest possible environmental standard.”
